# Settling Down Part 1

### GET YOUR SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBER (SIN)

When you arrive in Canada, one of the first things you'll want to do is to get your social insurance number (SIN). This is a unique number to you and is required by the Canadian government for all residents of Canada (including foreign students). Moreover, your SIN is needed if you want to work in Canada or receive benefits and services from government programs, such as medical plans.\*

#### WHERE TO GET YOUR SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBER
