TEACHING AND RESEARCH INTERESTS

Teaching: Canonical and non-canonical early Christian texts; aspects of women’s performance in early Christianity; issues of and constructions of gender and sexuality during the Greco-Roman period and late antique period; aspects of death, mourning and commemoration in early Christianity. I’m particularly interested in the intersection between text and image, and how these two mediums when applied together might help us reimagine early Christianity.

Research: Using a variety of methodologies such as social history, art history, anthropology, fields of classics and theology, I am interested in researching material culture, which offers a revealing look at understanding perceptions and constructions of gender, social identity, memory and political imperial power in Roman society. I am also interested in exploring ritual meals of early Christianity in the context of Greco-Roman world dining practises, with particular focus on the participation of women.
