

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Applicants are required to submit a 300-500 word statement describing their qualifications for the scholarship(s), their goals for their studies at VST, and their vision for their public and pastoral leadership after graduation. Good candidates for the scholarships possess authentic faith, imagination, vision, maturity, capacity for critical thinking, a keen sense of curiosity, and good communication skills.

Application Deadline for Consideration for Scholarships: March 15th for new students; October 15th for ISP students applying for the Indigenous Scholarship.

Summary of VST Scholarships

Chancellors' Scholarship: Each year, two Chancellor's scholarships of \$7,000.00 dollars will be awarded to students entering their final year of studies at Vancouver School of Theology.

Relocation Scholarship: \$2,500 CAD to be granted to students relocating to Vancouver to attend VST.

Promise for Public and Pastoral Leadership Scholarship: entering year scholarship to be granted to students who demonstrate promise for profound public and/or pastoral leadership. Awarded for the student's first year of studies at VST.

Academic Promise Scholarship: entering year scholarship to be granted to students who demonstrate academic promise for theological studies. Awarded for the student's first year of studies at VST.

International Student Scholarship: a minimum of one-year tuition scholarship, and renewable for up to a maximum of 5 years, or the total credit hours in degree program, whichever comes first. To be granted to an International student who demonstrates both the promise for public or pastoral leadership and academic promise in theological studies.

Indigenous Student Scholarship: a minimum of one-year tuition scholarship, and renewable for up to a maximum of 5 years, or the total credit hours in degree program, whichever comes first. To be granted to an Indigenous student who demonstrates both the promise for public or pastoral leadership and academic promise in theological studies. (ISP students will be considered only after completing a minimum of 3 courses in their program).

Part-time option for Entering Year Scholarships: Students who will not be studying full-time in their entering year at VST may elect to receive a total of \$6000 in tuition credits to be applied against their account over the course of up to 3 consecutive years of part-time study.
