Biblical Language Tools for Exegesis Fall 2023 Wednesdays 2–5 pm. Via Zoom

Course Description

PURPOSE:

This course is designed to introduce Biblical Hebrew and Koiné Greek (NT) to students who have no background in biblical languages and to provide enough knowledge to use lexicons, Bible software and other tools. The course includes a basic introduction to each language, emphasizing understanding the basic elements of a sentence to be able to analyze how a sentence creates meaning. The use of language resources and tools will be covered so that a student will be able to use these tools in doing exegesis in both languages. Six weeks of classes will be spent on each language, culminating in an open book exam for each language. A demonstration of Bible software will be included.

PREREQUISITES: None. Although a healthy curiosity will help.

COMPETENCE OBJECTIVES:

In successfully completing this course, a student will have the following competencies in both Biblical Greek and Biblical Hebrew:

- Ability to use language-analysis tools, both print and digital.
- Recognize and identify basic elements of the respective languages.
 - Know the alphabet and a selection of the most common words in each language.
 - Show familiarity with pronunciation of the language.
 - Be able to do word and phrase searches in the original languages.
 - Be able to look words up, especially using computer tools.
 - Identify the part of speech of a word (noun, verb, adjective, adverbs, preposition, conjunction, etc.)
 - Understand the basic principles of morphology (how and why words change their forms to express grammatical information (such as person, number, gender, tense, voice, mood, case/state, etc.)
- Draw conclusions as to the possible meanings of a sentence.
- Demonstrate proficiency in using lexicons and Bible software.

FORMAT AND CONTENT:

This is twelve-week course worth 3.0 credit hours. The course will consist of six weeks of instruction in each language—lectures and in-class exercises. Assignments and evaluation include in-class and homework exercises, quizzes, and a final assignment in each language. Both six-week sections must be completed to receive credit for the course.

This course will be taught by zoom, both synchronously at the same time as class, or asynchronously through recordings of class. Expectations for asynchronous students will be spelled out in the syllabus.
